<u>Career and Technical Training Program:</u> The Career and Technical Preparation Program at Franklin CAS offers classes in: Computer Operator / Literacy / Introduction to the Internet, General Clerk/Office Assistant, General Clerk/Introduction, Keyboarding, Computer Literacy and Computer Software Applications. Certification is awarded upon completion of the course competencies. A class fee is required for career and technical classes. Students may also be required to pay a registration fee. Please see the section on fees.

Parent Education: The Parent Education program is based on the premise that parenting is an on-going learning and growing process. The program is designed to guide parent and child through developmental levels as they relate to the family setting and educational process.

<u>Older Adult:</u> The program for Older Adults is designed to offer lifelong education that will provide opportunities for personal growth and development, community involvement, and survival skills for self-maintenance and economic self-sufficiency.

English as a Second Language: The English as a Second Language program is designed to offer instruction in English communication for limited English speaking students. It includes speaking, reading, writing, and listening skills. Lessons are presented within the contexts of every day life situations. There are seven levels of instruction in the ESL program: Literacy, Beginning Low, Beginning High, Intermediate Low, Intermediate High A, Intermediate High B, and Advanced Low. All students are evaluated for proper placement. There are no fees for ESL classes.

Home Study – Video ESL Distance Learning Program: Study ESL at home with videotapes. This program is offered for students who cannot attend classes regularly and for those who want to supplement their regular ESL classes. Pay a \$10 refundable deposit, and check out a dvd/video cassette and lessons. When you finish the dvd/tape return it for another

<u>CBET</u>, Community Based English Tutoring, is a component of our ESL program. The goal of CBET is to provide English to parents of limited English proficient children in grades K-12. Branch sites marked with the CBET logo provide adult students with a lending library of children books, as well as guidance and follow-up on parental tutoring of children. CBET encourages a personal, at-home English language family literacy environment.

**ESL/Citizenship:** Prepare to become a U.S. citizen. This course includes U.S. History and Government; the Constitution; organization of federal, state and local governments; individual privileges, duties, and responsibilities; and an emphasis on language skills. There are no fees for ESL/Citizenship classes.

<u>Basic Skills:</u> Students work in a supportive environment to improve basic academic skills related to success in the community, the work place and the family. The program features Basic Reading, Basic Math, and Basic Language (Writing) classes. There are no fees for Basic Skills classes.

GED: The GED is a nationally recognized high school equivalency test. It is offered twice a year at Franklin Community Adult School. The test is given in English and Spanish and tests five areas of knowledge: writing skills, social studies, reading skills, science and mathematics. A \$110.00 fee is charged to take the official GED test. We encourage GED candidates to prepare for the test by enrolling in our GED preparation class, and/or math and reading labs. Passing the GED test and taking 10-14 classes is another method to earn a high school diploma.

Cost: \$5.00 material class fee per lab class. No registration fee.

High School Diploma Program: Adults may earn a high school diploma through successful completion of 170 credits in the Diploma Plus program. Diploma Plus offers courses in the fundamental skills of reading, writing, and mathematics. In addition, life skills classes teach ways to live and manage more effectively and increase opportunities for job success.

In accordance with State of California regulations and LAUSD requirements, all high school graduates must pass the CAHSEE - California High School Exit Exam. Franklin Community Adult School offers remedial classes to help prepare for this exam.

<u>Graduation:</u> A cap and gown ceremony is held each June for graduates of the GED and High School Diploma programs. Many scholarships and awards are also presented during graduation.

Adult Independent Study – Academic Classes: Independent Study provides the opportunity to design a program of study that is responsive to the academic, personal and social needs of individual students. Students enrolled in independent study must be willing to work independently and keep scheduled appointments with their supervising teacher. Prior approval by an adult school counselor is required.

Alternative Education Work Center: Alternative Education and Work Center (AEWC) is a dropout recovery program. It is designed exclusively for at-risk youth between 16-18 years old who have not been able to continue their studies at their home high school. It provides an opportunity for these students to re-enter school at any time of the year. For more information, please call the AEWC Outreach Consultant at Ramona Hall, 4580 N. Accreditation: Franklin Community Adult School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and by the State Department of Education.

**Textbooks:** Board of Education textbooks for certain classes are available on a deposit basis. If the book is returned in satisfactory condition, the deposit will be refunded. Students wishing a refund on a book deposit must return the book by June 22, 2012. Other textbooks are available for purchase.

#### REFUNDS

- 1. To receive a refund, the student MUST RETURN THE FEE CARD AND/OR RECEIPT BEFORE THE THIRD CLASS MEETING.
- 2. A student who drops a class or classes will be assessed a \$10.00 drop fee per transaction.

<u>CLOSING OF CLASSES</u>: The administration reserves the right to close a class if insufficient numbers of students enroll, or if the attendance falls below standards set by the Board of Education.

**STUDENT BODY:** A voluntary student body membership fee of \$1 per school year for an Identification Card is collected upon enrollment. Fee is not refundable. Student photo identification cards are also available.

**<u>REGISTRATION:</u>** All classes are offered to the general public. There are no residency requirements.

#### REGULAR REGISTRATION

- 1. Students may enroll in a branch class at the time and place the class is scheduled to meet, except for A.I.S.
- 2. Students enrolling for classes at the Franklin campus should do so in the Counseling Office.
- 3. All programs are open entry-open exit. Enrollment is accepted throughout the year if space is available.

COSTS: Most courses are free. There is no registration or tuition fee for the following classes: Adult Basic Education, Elementary Subjects, English as a Second Language, High School Credit Courses, Citizenship, and Programs for Adults with Disabilities. A registration fee may be charged to students who enroll in vocational programs, Parent Education, or students between 18 to 60 years of age who enroll in Programs for Older Adults. Exemptions: Students who are 60 years of age or older, students receiving any form of public assistance, students with disabilities who qualify, students attending classes for high school credit, or current employees.

Registration Fees Per Semester: \$30 for courses from 18-25 weeks in length; \$25 for courses from 13-17 weeks in length; \$20 for courses 1-12 weeks in length

Material/Class Fees: In certain classes requiring materials and tools not furnished by the school district, a special class fee is charged. This fee ranges from \$5.00 to \$40.00 and is payable in cash by the second session the student attends.


